The quorum is 3 Board members or Alternates. Public comments on agenda items will be heard when the item is considered. Public comments on other matters within the council's jurisdiction may be made during the Public Comment period. Public comments are usually limited to two minutes per speaker, at the discretion of the Chair. Action may be taken on any agenda item except Public Comment and announcements. Actions may be reconsidered only if a motion for reconsideration is adopted at the same meeting where the action was taken. You may request a copy of printed materials that are distributed at the meeting. You may record the meeting by audio, video or photographic means as long as it is not disruptive. Meeting notices and agendas are posted at the Plaza Del Valle Community Room and at other locations (see notes below). If you need translation, or accommodation for a disability, please call the city Department of Neighborhood Empowerment at least three business days in advance (213-978-1551, or toll-free 3-1-1). The city is a covered entity under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act. If you believe the council is not following the law or its own rules you may file a grievance in writing with copies to both the Chair and the Secretary. Please be respectful of others, even when you differ with them. Times shown in the agenda are only estimates. The sequence and time may be changed at the meeting.

1. Call to Order and remarks (Pamela Gibberman, Chair)

Meeting called to order at 6:03 p.m.

2. Roll Call of committee members or alternates (the quorum is three).

Present: Pamela, John, Martha, Perla, Tony

Guests: Mike Hasz, Michael Menjivar, Diana Mendez, Angela Hyland-Fernandez(Note: Diana and Angela will be added as official members at the next Board meeting.)

3. Public Comment and announcements. *(Please limit to two minutes per speaker.)* Public comment on agenda Items will be heard at the time the item is considered.

Michael announced that LAUSD Board Member Kelly Gonez would attend the next PCNC Board Meeting.

- **4. Follow-up** on past items.
 - a. As discussed at our last meeting, we are hoping that students from the leadership class at Panorama HS will be able to assist with distributing the door-hangers which will explain how to request a ballot for the upcoming PCNC elections. The contact person is Angela Hyland-Fernandez, PHS Community School Coordinator. Note: Vista MS Principal Damonte has indicated that Vista MS students would not be participating in this activity.
 - **b.** The PCNC Rules Committee has prepared a flyer explaining how young people could safely help with this project (it will be distributed with this agenda). Members of the PCNC Youth Committee received it and were encouraged to share it with their parents.

The above two items were discussed.

- **5. Reports** from Chair about meetings attended since our last meeting:
 - **a.** The Chair attended the Vista MS Coffee with the Principal meeting on 2/5/21. The counseling staff was introduced and they explained about the counseling groups and clubs available for students as well as office hours for students and parents to speak with them. The magnet school offerings at Vista MS and later Panorama HS were described. Parents were asked to fill out the School Needs Survey. The Covid-19 testing site has moved from Vista MS to Panorama HS.
 - **b.** On 2/23/21 the Monroe Community of Schools held a Virtual Town Hall. Opening remarks were made by Cara Schneider, MCoS Administrator. LAUSD Board Members Scott Schmerelson and Kelly Gonez also welcomed attendees and shared information. The two options for adding an additional 10 days to next year's school calendar were discussed followed by an instant poll: Option 1 1st semester=8/10/21-12/17/21, 2-week winter break, 2nd semester=1/3/22-6/10/22 received 42% and Option 2 1st semester 8/3/21-12/17/21, 3-week winter break, 2nd semester=1/10/22-6/10/22 received 58%. The Local Control and Accountability Plan budget process was explained. For information and/or to subscribe to their newsletter, send an email to monroeCOS@lausd.net
- **6. Discussion** and possible action on recommending to the PCNC Board that it urge LAUSD to support the Arts ARE Education Resolution, which asks school boards to resolve that the district will continue to fully fund and provide appropriate resources in support of arts education programs in a manner proportionate to all other subjects that are part of a well-rounded education. A copy of this resolution will be distributed with the agenda.

John moved, Martha seconded, the above motion which passed unanimously with 7 yes, 0 no, 0 abstentions (Diana and Angela were included in the count.)

- **7. Discussion** about items for the next meeting which will be Monday, **April 26, 2021**. Tony suggested an initiative to involve all our MS and HS students in the voting process.
- **8. Public Comment** and announcements. **(Please limit to two minutes per speaker.)**Angela said Panorama HS is working hard to prepare for the return of students to campus. Out of a population of 1331 about 15% are expected back for hybrid learning. There would be tutoring during Spring Break. Unfortunately the mandated State testing will occur.
- 9. Adjournment

Meeting adjourned at 6:47 p.m.

Council Process: The council gained its official city role upon certification by the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners on March 15, 2007. Everyone who lives, works or owns real property within the boundaries of the Panorama City Neighborhood Council, or who declares a Community Interest in the area and the basis for it, is a "stakeholder". All stakeholders are members of the Council. Stakeholders elect a Board of Directors to represent them. This Board is recognized as the decision-making entity by the City of Los Angeles. The current Board was elected on April 2, 2016. While the Board is the official decision-making entity, meetings are conducted as much as possible in a town hall spirit. Committees are open to anyone with an interest in Panorama City. Panorama City's neighborhood council is much more than its Board, and it depends on public participation for its

Posting Sites: California's open meetings law, the Ralph M. Brown Act, requires that meeting notices be physically posted at a regular location 72 hours in advance for regular meetings and 24 hours in advance for special meetings. The location must be accessible to the public seven days a week, 24 hours a day. That location is the outside steel doors of the Plaza Del Valle Community Room, Building G, 8700 Van Nuys Blvd, Panorama City, CA 91402. This council is also required to follow the City of Los Angeles posting policy for Neighborhood Councils. That policy additionally requires that councils post agendas through the city's Early Notification System (ENS), post the agendas on the council's website (if one exists), and

make an effort to send agendas by electronic mail (if such a list exists). This council posts agendas on its website, panoramacitync.org. This council uses the city's ENS mailing list as its agenda email list. You may sign up for the ENS agenda system at:

In order to respect our stakeholders' inboxes, messages to the informational email list will be sent at most once or twice a month. The only way to assure that you will receive emailed agendas is through the ENS list.

Virtual Meeting Guidelines

- ? Upon entry to the meeting, all participants will be automatically placed on 'mute' as to not disrupt the current speaker.
- ? The Chair will run the meeting as 'close to normal' as possible, limiting the amount of time individual speakers may hold the floor.
- ? If you wish to speak, do so by 'Raising your Hand', a feature the platform has, which enables the formation of a queue.

- ? The Board Secretary will recognize your place in the queue, by responding through the 'Chat' feature.
- ? The Chair will then call upon, in 'first come first served' order as recognized by the Secretary. Once called upon, the speaker must UNMUTE their audio to begin their statement.
- ? Disruptions to the meeting or abuse of these guidelines will result in the immediate removal.
- ? Public Comment will also adhere to the 'Raise Hand', 'Enter the Queue', 'Be Recognized by the Chair' format.
